2. Please provide Live Load, Collateral Load, and Eave Height for the Chemical Canopy.

As stated in Section 13121.1.05.B, live load is the snow load as called out on S-01,. There are no additional collateral loads other than self weight of the structure, roof, ceiling, etc. Eave Height was addressed in Addendum No. 3, Item 42.

3. Section 17560 paragraph 3.02, is it acceptable to do that training at with a qualified in-house trainer?

1. Section 17560 paragraph 3.02, DELETE in its entirety.

CHANGES TO CONTRACT DRAWINGS:
